SUBJECT: Character Statement for C1C Adam C. DeRito

1. I am a first class cadet in cadet squadron 11 and a cadet in good standing.

- 2. I have known C1C DeRito since freshman year as my teammate on the Rugby team. I have seen him two to three times a week during season since then and have spent a great deal of time with him in and out of uniform.
- 3. C1C DeRito has always been an example of what good moral character and ethics look like in a person. Ever since freshman year, I have looked up to C1C DeRito for always standing by these values. He has a strong sense of right and wrong and is not afraid to defend it. Despite friendly jesting typical on the rugby team, C1C DeRito has never backed down. I have never seen him once give in to peer pressure or manipulation. He is even willing to be ostracized to maintain his beliefs. I find this very admirable in any person.
- 4. Not only does he stand by his convictions but he is very hard working. If he was not at the rugby field, C1C DeRito was always participating in training events to prepare him for his dreams of joining the Marine Corps. He sacrificed personal time, which could have been spent socializing or relaxing, to push himself farther to the next level. I have never seen someone so dedicated to a dream, and so unwilling to give it up. He is truly an inspiration to us all.
